



Discussion Guide for “Where’s the Line?” *Ask Better Questions Week 2*

Our culture values personal freedom above all else. We’re not the first to do so – the Corinthians did too. But the Apostle Paul challenges personal freedom as the highest value, observing that when what matters most is my desires, I become a slave to those desires. Instead, Paul insists personal freedom must submit to the law of Love. We belong to each other.

Epiphany Question:

During this season, spend time each week in prayer and meditation over a question about your calling. This week, sit with the question “**How am I using my freedom?**”

Questions for Discussion

1. How highly do you value your personal freedom? Where does it rank in terms of importance of values?
2. Where is personal freedom good? When does it become toxic?
3. How were the Corinthians abusing their personal freedom? Why was “What am I allowed to do?” the wrong question to be asking?
4. Describe how Paul reframes the Corinthians’ questions around love. What does it mean to say that we belong to each other?
5. What does it look like for you to use your freedom to show love for God and your neighbors this week?
