

## Discussion Guide for "For Goodness Snakes" The Devil in the Details Week 4

What is the goal of faith? Is it safety? Is it a sense of control? Prestige and position? These were in Nicodemus' mind when he sought out Jesus. But Jesus' words to him are confounding: Jesus will become a snake, lifted up for the world to see. How does this image challenge our ideas of who God is and what God wants from us? How can Jesus-the-snake invite us to become more loving, more present in our world?

## **Lenten Challenge:**

Find an image of the crucifixion (<u>here's a good one if you need it</u>). Spend 10 minutes a day this week meditating on the image of Jesus raised up like the snake. Ask God what it looks like for you to imitate him this week.

## **Questions for Discussion**

- 1. What are your biggest goals in life?
- 2. Who was Nicodemus? What do you think he was after in life?
- 3. Why does Jesus compare himself to a snake? How would this have confused Nicodemus? What does it say about God?
- 4. Reread John 3:14-21. Why is a crucified God hard to follow, especially in our culture? How do we judge ourselves when we are offended by a God who dies?
- 5. Return to what you said in the first question. How can your biggest goals or deepest desires become idols? How does the crucified Jesus reframe those goals and desires?
