#### **Questions for Discussion**

- 1. What do you think of when you hear the word "myth"? How is this similar or different from what JR. and Sue discussed?
- 2. When were the mythologies at the beginning of the Bible compiled and edited? Why is that setting important for understanding the meaning?
- 3. What are some key differences between the Enuma Elish and Genesis 1? Why do those differences matter?
- 4. Review the movement in Genesis 1 from 'formless and empty' to 'formed and filled'. What does this have to say about who God is and our relationship to God?
- 5. What does it mean to say God moves us from chaos to order? What does that mean for your week?
