



Discussion Guide for “Curiosity”

Table Setting Week 4

'Curiosity' is not a word we associate with churches. Churches are more often known for quieting questions and insisting we 'just have faith.' But curiosity is a virtue - the most faithful people in Scripture were often curious. That's a good thing because God is bigger than any box we make, and when we choose to be curious, we often discover God in new and surprising ways. 3. Consider Moses' encounter with the burning bush in Exodus 3. How would you have reacted if you were in his sandals? Why do you think God used this technique to catch Moses' attention?
4. Compare Moses to Zacchaeus. Do you see yourself reflected in either of these men? Discuss.
5. What are you curious about in regards to faith? What are some of your biggest questions?
